That's because fenbendazole, the active ingredient in SAFE-GUARD, features a unique mode of action that makes it highly potent to the parasite yet incredibly safe for your dog. Fenbendazole is uniquely attracted to the cells of the parasite rather than the cells of the dog. This is what makes it safe for all dogs, including puppies and pregnant females. The unique three-day dosing regimen works best to ensure that all four major types of parasites are treated safely and completely. And, there are no contraindications with SAFE-GUARD so it should be compatible with other medications your dog may be taking.

Application Instructions

- Weigh your dog to make sure you are using the correct dosage.
- Follow the box directions for daily dosage requirements. (see chart insert)
- The same dosage must be administered for three consecutive days.
- Do not stop treatment before the end of the three-day treatment period.

Your veterinarian is your dog's other best friend. It is a good idea to schedule regular visits to discuss your pet's overall health and immunization program.

Consult your veterinarian for assistance in the diagnosis, treatment and control of parasitism.

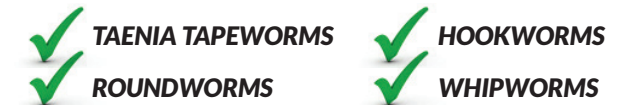

Dangerous Parasites to the Outdoor Dog

The more your dog is outside, the greater the risk of infection.

Roundworms

- Female worms lay several thousand eggs a day, which are passed in the feces.
- Eggs can survive in the environment for several years.
- Canine roundworm infections are zoonotic meaning they can be transmitted from animals to humans.

Hookworms

- Female worms lay eggs by the thousands which are passed in the feces.
- Eggs survive well in mild temperatures, shade and moist soil or grass.
- Outdoors dogs can be infected and re-infected by accidentally eating the eggs or larvae (immature worms) in the environment.

Taenia Tapeworms

- Tapeworms consist of a head from which a series of segments grow.
- Eggs are found in the individual segments which are passed in the feces.
- Rabbits or rodents accidentally ingest the eggs when grazing.

Think your heartworm treatment has your dog covered? Think again.

While many heartworm treatments include roundworm and hookworm protection, they may not treat tapeworms and whipworms, which can be especially problematic for outdoor dogs.

Whipworms

- Whipworms infect not only dogs, but also wildlife such as foxes and coyotes.
- Eggs are passed to the environment in the feces on an intermittent basis where they remain.
- Not all dewormers are effective against whipworms.

Flea and tick treatments help prevent infections from the parasites they carry. But *Taenia pisiformis* tapeworm is carried by rabbits and rodents, the prey of many outdoor dogs.
